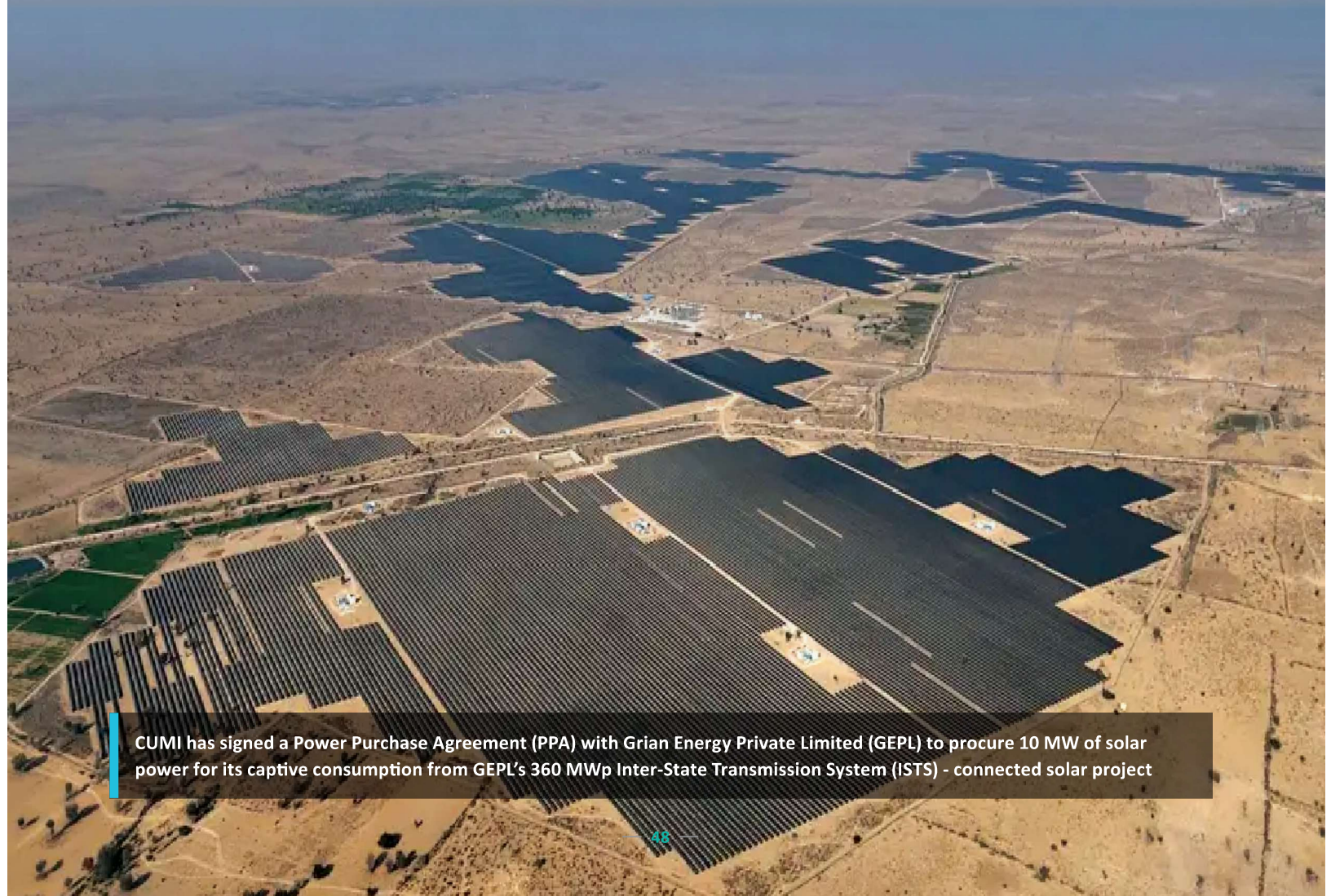

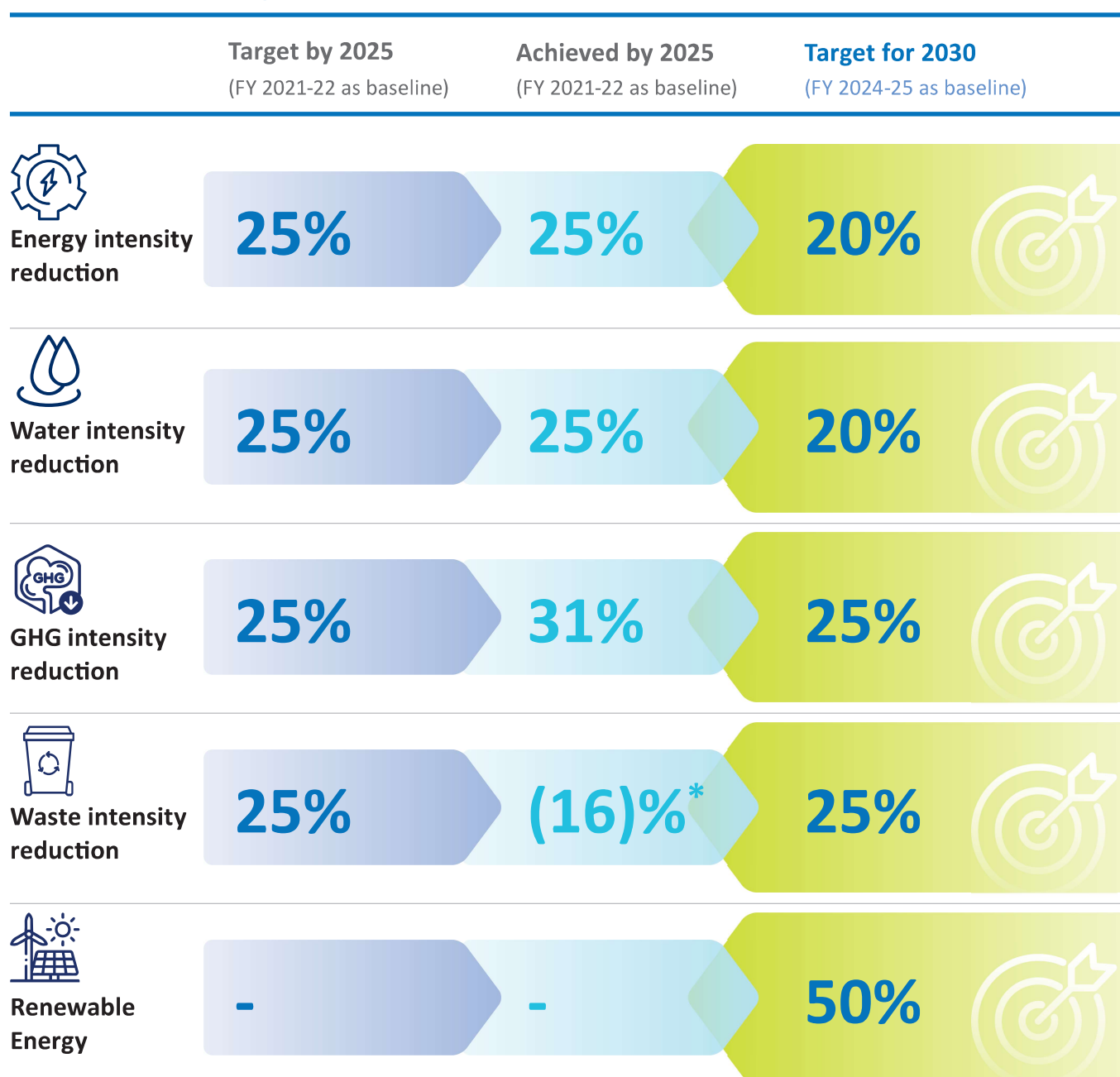
CUMI has signed a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with Grian Energy Private Limited (GEPL) to procure 10 MW of solar power for its captive consumption from GEPL's 360 MWp Inter-State Transmission System (ISTS) - connected solar project

With the formation of a dedicated Environment, Health & Safety (EHS) function, we have institutionalised our commitment to sustainability, workplace safety, and environmental responsibility. By embracing cleaner technologies, optimising resource consumption, and aligning our processes with global environmental best practices, we stay

on course to achieve our long-term sustainability vision. CUMI has been making continuous efforts to reduce the intensity in terms of GHG emissions, energy, water and waste. In FY 2021-22, the Company had set a target of 25% intensity reduction across energy, water, emission, and waste by 2025. We have met the target for 3 parameters.

With respect to waste, we recalibrated the parameter owing to adjustment of baseline data. The intensity indicates an upward trend which will now be measured against the updated baseline with respect to the new targets.
